**Presentation Title** – keep it short, 2 lines if possible!

Abstract - the official conference language is English and no translation service will be provided. The abstract must also be written in English using *MS Office Word*. In order for two abstracts to fit on each page (8.5”x11”; 1” margins), the total length of the abstract, including authors and affiliations, should be no longer than 22 lines. No graphics or footnotes allowed. Please use “Times New Roman” 12pt font with single line spacing.
